Come dance to celebrate diversity!

On Friday, October 19, at 7:00 p.m. at St. John's United Methodist Church, and in celebration of St. John's 20<sup>th</sup> anniversary as a Reconciling Congregation, the TTU Vernacular Music Center presents "A Rainbow Balfolk Dance Party," an all-inclusive, LGBTQ-friendly evening of friendly participatory Euro-French folk dancing to live music, hosted by dance teacher Anne Wharton, with musicians (fiddle, accordion, bagpipes, hurdy-gurdy, bass guitar) from the VMC and "that lil' ol' drone band from Texas," RattleSkull!

A "Bal" is an evening of participatory and non-binary Euro-French folk dances to live music. Balfolk TTU musicians and dancers provide a friendly, open-access introduction to the accessible Euro-French dances and music of "Balfolk": Chapelloise, Cercle Circassien, polka, mazurka, schottische, bourrée à deux et trois. The event will be preceded at 6:30 p.m. by a quick 30-minute "jump-start" introduction for those to whom the dances are new.

The St. John's Rainbow Bal is free (donations accepted!) and open to the public and all are welcome.

#### Sunday, October 21

Join St. John's in celebrating 20 years as a Reconciling Congregation!

On Sunday, October 21, at 10:30 a.m. St. John's will host Reconciling Sunday, with guest pastor, David Meredith.

Rev. Meredith began ministry as pastor of the Clifton United Methodist Church in 2012. A 1984 graduate of Saint Paul School of Theology in Kansas City, Missouri, Rev. Meredith served a variety of ministry settings prior to going to Clifton UMC.



Meredith offers leadership on the Board of Directors of the Reconciling Ministry Network in Evanston, Illinois, which is working deliberately to bring full-inclusion for LGBTQ persons in the United Methodist denomination. Similarly, Rev. Meredith's experience as Urban Ministry Director of the Ohio River Valley District will expand his congregation's involvement in its outreach and work for social justice with persons and communities facing the struggles of poverty and race in Cincinnati. Ministry with young adults and college students will continue to grow at the church as Meredith brings his experiences at Miami University, Capital University, and Ohio State University to the congregation's current ministry with the University of Cincinnati and Wesley House. As a former music educator, Meredith is also really excited when engaged in excellent music and arts endeavors.

There will be no 8:15 a.m. service on Reconciling Sunday. Following service, there will be a potluck to celebrate our anniversary, as well as to honor our pastors for pastor appreciation month. SPRC will provide brisket and asks the congregation to bring sides, rolls, and desserts.

Rev. Kate Floyd grew up in St. John's and is a pastor because of her relationship with the church and that of parents, Daisy and Tim Floyd, who was chair of the Reconciling Committee when we voted to be a reconciling congregation. Kate is married to Kyle Tau, who serves as an Ecumenical Staff Officer with the Council of Bishops. They have two children. Kate's brother, Will, also grew up in thechurch.



About two years ago, Kate was commissioned to start a new church in Arlington, VA, and now it has come to fruition! What a

great joy this is, and so St. John's love and message are surely being spread. Kate has asked many times for prayers.
