In October of 1998, after years of dedicated study, dialogue and prayer, the members of St. John's voted to join the Reconciling Movement in the United Methodist Church. Today marks the 22nd anniversary of our affiliation with Reconciling Ministries Network. It is a day to recall our history, learn more about what it means to be reconciling, celebrate this important anniversary, and move into the future with a renewed commitment to justice for persons of all sexual orientations and gender identities. Reconciling Ministries Network (RMN) is the national grassroots organization leading the United Methodist Church (UMC) in creating space at the table for all God's children. Its mission is to mobilize United Methodists of all sexual orientations and gender identities to transform our Church and world into the full expression of Christ's inclusive love. Why is this important? It is important because the UMC continues its sanctioned discrimination against gay and lesbian persons as official policy in our United Methodist Book of Discipline. Though the UMC has officially corrected previous positions of prejudice that once supported other injustices such as slavery, segregation, and the in equality of women, it continues to single out and exclude gay and lesbian persons by denying ordination and marriage equality. Because this exclusion does harm, and has tarnished the reputation of the Church in society, we must love more boldly, reach out more intentionally, work to build relationships, help to educate, provide safe space for conversation, and create change in the Church and in the world. We give thanks for the leadership and members of the St. John's family of October 1998, along with all those who prepared the way and all those who have joined since that day. We are grateful for St. John's spirit of welcome, commitment to advocacy, and Christ-like example of loving our neighbors as we love ourselves.




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WAYS TO GIVE
