

Holy Week Services at St. John's



Palm Sunday

Sunday, March 24 at 8:15 & 10:30a.m.

The first Sunday of Holy Week is commonly called "Palm Sunday" or "Passion Sunday." Those who call it "Palm Sunday" tend to highlight Jesus' entry into Jerusalem to shouts of "Hosanna! Blessed is the one who comes in the name of the Lord!" It is important to capture the irony. This is the day on which Jesus entered the city in triumph, but as a part of his journey to the cross; this is the week in which the crowd's cries of "Hosanna!" would soon turn to "Crucify him!"



Maundy Thursday

Thursday, March 28 at 6:00p.m.

Maundy Thursday is an alternate name for Holy Thursday, the first of the three days of solemn remembrance of the events leading up to and immediately following the crucifixion of Jesus. The English word "Maundy" comes from the Latin mandatum, which means "commandment."

As recorded in John's gospel, on his last night before his betrayal and arrest, Jesus washed the feet of his disciples and then gave them a new commandment to love one another as he had loved them (John 13:34).

Good Friday

Friday, March 29 at 6:00_{p.m.}

Good Friday, or Holy Friday as most of the rest of the world calls it in their languages, proclaims God's purpose of loving and redeeming the world even in the face of human rejection and cruelty through the cross of our Lord, Jesus Christ. It is a day that is holy and makes us holy because God was drawing the world to God's self in Christ.

On Easter Sunday, we celebrate the good news that in Christ's death and resurrection we, and all creation, are continually being made new by God's love and saving grace.
