From the Lectionary

Good Shepherd The Catacombs of Domitilla

The Catacombs of Domitilla are located along the ancient via Ardeatina and are among the largest in Rome; their origin dates back to some burial grounds built on a property belonging to Flavia Domitilla, related to the imperial family of Vespasiano. The underground cemetery developed between the second and third centuries A.D., and includes, in addition to the galleries and corridors on four different levels, a semi-underground basilica built at the end

of the fourth century during the pontificate of Pope Damasus, Behind the apse there is a tunnel with a fresco depicting Santa Petronilla in an attitude of praying, introducing the deceased Veneranda into the sky.

The artwork in the catacombs includes this imagery of a Good Shepherd, the earliest in existence.
