The Baptism of Jesus Cara B. Hochhalter

Jesus was baptized in the Jordan River amid the beauty of creation, not at a baptismal font inside a temple. He experienced the spirit and peace of God fall upon him as the heavens opened up. Imagine God's Spirit falling upon him "like a dove." I created this image while staying in a cabin in the Cascade Mountains of Washington State. The window looked out on the Skykomish River—and I imagined Jesus being baptized there. In the process

of creating this print, I turned the block, making a shadow image. How surprising to see another face appear on Jesus' chest! Suddenly the words from scripture became clear. "And a voice came from heaven, 'You are my Son, the Beloved..." Jesus would hold God within him—and show us all how we might also carry God, and be carried by God, throughout our
